The Pastor's Message

Dear People of Jolliff UMC:

May the peace and grace of the risen Christ be with you!

I remember a pastor who said he loved his job. He especially loved asking people, "How can I pray for you?" I think the pastor really loved his job because he knew that his job was not letting him help people but letting God help them. Often, I am tempted to act like God by asking, "How can I help you?" instead of "How can I pray for you?" Of course, I should ask, "How can I pray for you?" and then, "How can I help you?"



I was shocked because even the devil can kindly ask us, "How can I help you?" In Genesis 3, the snake approaches Adam and Eve by hiding his bad intentions and falsely asks, "How can I help you?" This is the beginning of the Fall—disobeying God. They shouldn't have responded to the snake. As I prayed for him, I felt helpless before the power of death. No one can break the circle of life - birth, aging, sickness, and death. How can I pray for him in Hospice care?

Suddenly, God inspired me to put myself in the position of the man in hospice care. If I am in hospice care, I will be so scared and hopeless. At the moment, maybe I will pray to God for a miracle to heal me. But I should really pray to God for comfort, peace, courage, and hope to be ready to finish the journey on earth and enter the eternal Kingdom of God. Yes, that should be my prayer on my deathbed.

Beloved, how can I pray for you?

Chilly weather has been passing, and spring is coming. During winter, everything seemed to have died, but now flowers and leaves are appearing everywhere. Nature teaches us the mystery of death and resurrection. Likewise, "Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures." (1 Corinthians 15:3-4)

I pray God, who raised Jesus from the dead, may empower us to experience the power of resurrection by the Holy Spirit now and forever.
